## 1. Membership Categories

### 1.1 Individual Membership Categories

There are now four categories of individual membership available.

**Starter** – For newcomers to the sport, irrespective of whether they ultimately intend to compete or simply just enjoy a recreational form of fencing

**Recreational** – For people who want to fence in a club, participate in inter-club matches, but do not want to compete in conventional fencing competitions

**Compete** – For people that want to compete (87% of current membership)

**Support** – For volunteers, fans, supporters and parents

For clubs there will be a separate club membership available. All clubs will need to register with British Fencing and have a valid club membership to benefit from club insurance and any discounts offered via British Fencing or the Home Countries for the registration of members.

The prices shown include the maximum discounts which are available online through direct debit or through affiliated clubs and coaches.

### **2.2 Non Fencers**

If you do not actually participate in fencing there is a category of membership called 'Support' which gives you the insurance benefits of public liability and personal accident. This ensures that you are personally covered for the typical volunteer activities that are undertaken in fencing, whether you perform them on behalf of yourself, your section, your region, your club or competition.

This membership category has access to online copies of the Sword, but will not be entitled to vote at the BF AGM. For information on the Home Country voting rights conferred on each category please visit the Home Country website. The cost of this membership is £12/year for adults, £10/year for U18s.

The standard Membership (whether Support/Starter/Recreational/Compete) does not include liability insurance cover if you are operating in a professional capacity – eg coaching or refereeing for payment. To benefit from this you must be on the relevant BF register to be fully covered. There may be an additional charge in some cases for this registration. #### 5.1 BF Age Restrictions for Under 13 and Under 20 Membership

## Membership Categories and Benefits

If applying for an Under 13 or Under 20 membership with BF you must be under 13 or 20 on the date of application.

### **BF Minimum Competition Age Rules**

#### **1. Under 13s**

The FIE rule requires a fencer to be 13 by 1st January (ie. before 1st Jan) in order to compete in any FIE events in that calendar year. (This includes the Cadet World Championships).

The same rule applies to all UK events that can include adults ie all senior and junior (U20) competitions. So, for example, a fencer who was born in 1999 will not be able to enter any senior or junior events until 2013. This does not apply to any UK cadet events - see 2 below.

#### **2. Minimum Age for Cadet (U17) Events**

The European Fencing Confederation requires a fencer to be 11 on 1st January in order to compete in any EFC Cadet Circuit events in that calendar year.

The same rule applies to all UK cadet events.

### **6. Club Membership**

Registration for club membership of British Fencing costs £40.

Benefits for the clubs include:

- 1) Public Liability (typically a pre-condition of venue hire)
- 2) Fencers may affiliate to the club in the competitive membership category and represent the club in BF/HC competitions
- 3) Non BF member fencers participating in beginner sessions are extended the benefits of public liability (subject to additional conditions)
- 4) Bulk registration of members, with discounts of up to £5 on membership fees even if Direct Debit is not used.
- 5) Support for grant applications (typically NGBs are required to endorse applications for local public funding – a pre-condition to this is that the club is a member of the NGB)

Clubs are expected to encourage all fencers participating in a club to hold individual membership of BF. Individual non-members, even if they are fencing in member clubs or under the instruction of registered coaches are NOT afforded the insurance benefits of members except in specific circumstances (see point 3 above).
