



# SENIOR RANKING SCHEME

With effect from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2017

# DEFINITIONS

Season	The 12-month period starting on the 1st day of September in each year.		
Senior	Open to fencers aged 13 or over before 1st January in the calendar year of the competition.		
OpenA single gender, individual Competition held in the Ireland (ROI) which any Senior member is permitted on payment of the appropriate fee.			
Registered	Approved for registration as a Ranking Event by British Fencing.		
Rankings Manager	A person nominated by British Fencing to take decisions on ranking issues.		
FIE Competition	Any individual Senior competition appearing on the FIE calendar including such events held in the UK.		
Competition	A contest between a group of individuals using a single type of weapon (e.g. "Men's Foil", "Women's Sabre") organised in accordance with British Fencing rules.		
Event	One or more Competitions typically held in the same venue, under the same organising committee over a period of no more than a few consecutive days (e.g. UK Opens, FIE Competitions) and intended to be repeated on an annual basis.

## 1 Overview

## 1.1 Purpose of the Ranking System

The British Fencing National Ranking System is a benefit of membership and provided as a service to members.

These rankings are intended to:-

- Provide a quantitative means for members to evaluate their performance over time and by comparison with other fencers.
- Provide data for organisers to assist in ranking UK domestic Events.
- Provide assistance to selectors where ranking is a component in selection.

#### 1.2 Background

With effect from 1<sup>st</sup> September 1999 there has been a rolling ranking scheme for all fencers eligible to take part in Senior Competitions.

Responsibility for the administration of the Ranking Scheme lies with the Rankings Manager whose decision on any ranking matter shall be final. The Ranking Scheme in each weapon is carried out to the same rules by the identified ranking co-ordinators.

Rankings are calculated by aggregating the points awarded to each fencer in accordance with the rules laid down in this document.

#### 1.3 Application

This version of the Ranking Scheme applies to all Competitions and rankings published from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2017.

## 2 Rules

## 2.1 Eligibility

All British Fencing members holding an annual Competition licence are entitled to a place on the ranking irrespective of nationality or affiliation with another FIE country (c.f. section 5).

Inclusion on the BFA ranking list does not guarantee eligibility for selection, even in cases where an automatic selection is determined by ranking. Factors such as nationality, fitness and discipline will normally form an integral part of the selection rules and fencers should refer to the scheme in question to determine their eligibility.

### 2.2 Qualifying Results

Fencers may score points in any Registered Senior Individual Ranking Open Competition or in any official FIE Individual Competition.

All Competitions must be run in accordance with a standard formula broadly in line with FIE Article o.11 as specified in the BFA Competition registration requirements. Competitions which do not conform to this requirement will be subject to a penalty or exclusion (c.f. section 3).

#### 2.3 Calculation of Points

Points are awarded to fencers who reach the last 128 provided that they are placed in the top 75% of those competing.

- The 75th percentile limit shall be rounded down to the next lowest whole number. For example, in a competition with 85 competitors only those ranked 1 to 63 shall be awarded points (75% of 85 is 63.75).
- In case of equality at the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile limit, both fencers shall be included. For example given an entry of 10 fencers and equal 7<sup>th</sup> places, both fencers placed 7<sup>th</sup> would be awarded points.

The points scored in each competition are calculated by taking the grading multiplier and multiplying this by the factor assigned to each final placing (c.f. section 4) and then rounding down to the nearest whole number.

The fencer's overall points total is the sum of their best **SIX** results of which no more than **FOUR** results may be from FIE Competitions.

#### 2.4 Timing

Calculation of the ranking points will normally be done on a monthly basis in the first week of each month using the actual results of relevant competitions during the period of twelve months ending on the last day of the previous month.

The earliest publication date for provisional monthly rankings is the first working day following the first full weekend after the last Registered Competition. A list of target publication dates can be found on the British Fencing website.

The date of any Competition shall be taken to be the date of the final.

Each Competition shall be counted no more than once in any ranking. The results are included for a period of 12 months or until the date of the same Competition in the following Season, whichever occurs first.

### 2.5 Corrections and Clarifications

All correction and clarification requests should be notified within 5 working days of publication to headoffice@britishfencing.com cc'd to rankings@britishfencing.com. The aim is to resolve queries within 10 days of publication after which the rankings will be marked as confirmed and available for use in selection.

#### 2.6 Ranking Method

Fencers will be ranked in descending order of total points scored starting at rank number 1.

Where two or more fencers have the same number of points they will be assigned an equal ranking.

The positions following any equality shall be calculated as if no equal rankings existed. For example, after two fencers placed 10<sup>th</sup> equal, the following ranking assigned shall be 12<sup>th</sup>.

## 2.7 Duties of Competition Organisers

Organisers must ensure that all competitors are in possession of current British Fencing membership which includes entitlement to enter Open Competitions.

N.B. Overseas Fencers are now required to have a valid British Fencing membership. For details of how to obtain a temporary membership number which will entitle the holder to compete, please see the British Fencing website.

Organisers must provide British Fencing with a complete and accurate set of results from first to last place as soon as practically possible and in any event no later than 5 days after the final.

Results submitted after 5 days and up to 30 days will be included subject to the penalty specified in Section 3 below.

All results must include valid BFA Membership or temporary licence numbers for all competitors.

# 3 Table of Penalties

Use of a non-standard formula.	Reduction in Grading Multiplier (c.f. 4.1) of 10% to 50% before any rounding or exclusion at the discretion of British Fencing.	Each Competition individually.
Any matter which in the opinion of British Fencing materially reduces the safety of the Competitors.	Exclusion.	The Event.
Any matter which in the opinion of British Fencing affects the Competition in such a way as to make the calculated Grading Multiplier not represent the strength of the Competition.	Reduction in Grading Multiplier (c.f. 4.1) of 10% to 50% before any rounding at the discretion of British Fencing.	Each Competition individually or the Event as determined by British Fencing.

British Fencing reserve the right to reduce or remove ranking points from any Competition for matters not covered by these rules.

\* An Event or Competition to which a penalty is applied will not be entitled to automatic renewal of its "Registered" status and will need to reapply for the following Season.

The above penalties may be applied at any time. Rankings which have already been published will be adjusted accordingly.

# 4 Grading Multipliers

## 4.1 Method of Calculation

## 4.2 Final Position Multiplication Factors

The multiplication factor for each position (p) will calculated by the formula:

$$f(p) = T - (\log_{10}(p) * G) - (ceil(log_2(p)) * S)$$

using the constants: T (top score) = 20, G (gradient) = 2.6, S (step) = 2

The results of this formula to 128<sup>th</sup> place are shown in the following table.

# 5 Fencers

#### 5.1 Universal Membership Requirement

Any fencer of any nationality who attends a UK club for longer than the insurance threshold (currently 12 hours of active participation) must have BFA membership. Any fencer who is resident in the UK and wishes to enter a UK competition must have BFA membership.

In order to enter UK Open Competitions, the grade of membership must include a Competition Licence.

- Under the 2017 scheme, this means that only "Compete" membership types are acceptable but members and organisers are advised to check the BFA web site for changes.
- "UK Resident" for the purpose of the ranking scheme means all situations where the individual in question has not recently travelled from another country with the intent of returning shortly after the Competition. If you are in any doubt then you are most likely a UK Resident for ranking purposes but please contact British Fencing HQ for clarification.

#### 5.2 Overseas Fencers

Fencers **who are not UK residents and do not attend a UK club** must obtain a temporary membership and competition licence from the BFA web site. The licence must be valid for all days of the Competition.

Holders of temporary licenses are not entitled to a place on the ranking.

In the event that a temporary licence holder becomes a BFA member, only those points earned after the membership start date shall count towards ranking and no previously published rankings will be amended.

#### 5.3 Calculation of NIF for Overseas Fencers

Overseas Fencers participating in Opens will be assigned a notional NIF value based on their world ranking (if any) and otherwise (or if higher) on the NIF of BFA members finishing below them in the final ranking.

Only NIFs allocated to BFA members on the most recent ranking shall be included for the purposes of calculating a notional NIF.

The notional NIF calculated shall be valid only for the single Competition and shall not influence future calculations.

#### 5.4 Calculation of NIF for BFA Members

NIF values shall be assigned to members based on their weapon and position in the ranking list twice a year, on 1<sup>st</sup> September and 1<sup>st</sup> March. The NIF assigned shall be used to calculate the grading multiplier for competitions until the next biannual assignment.

The ranking range used for each weapon is set to reflect the number of members on the ranking list and strength of the weapon.
