1. Be a current member of British Fencing

- You need to have a Recreational or Compete membership.

In order to be on the BF Coach Register, coaches need to comply with minimum standards. Once the standards are met, coaches will be covered by BF insurance.

3. Have a Criminal Record Check

Coaches based in...

- England and Wales need an Enhanced DBS certificate (Standard and Basic are not accepted).
- Guernsey need a GVB.
- NI need an AccessNI.
- Scotland need a Disclosure Scotland.
- Your DBS certificate needs to be registered for the online Update Service.

5. Safeguarding Training

You need to demonstrate an understanding of safeguarding in the sporting context, by participating in one of the following courses:

- SafeGuard <u>Core</u>
- Sport Scotland's <u>Child Wellbeing</u> and <u>Protection in Sport and</u>
- NI Sport's Safeguarding Children & Young People Workshop.

2. Hold a qualification in Coaching Fencing

- You will need to be a qualified Coach.

- Overseas qualifications are accepted.

4. First Aid Training

Minimum course accepted:

- Emergency First Aid at Work. This is a face to face course, 6 hours long.
- Online alternatives are not accepted.
- Click here to find course providers near you.
- Declaration: if there is First Aid cover at all your coaching venues, we accept a signed Declaration.

7. Create a Coach Profile

- Every coach has a unique profile page that is displayed on BF's <u>Coach Search</u> page.
- Coaches can select whether their location and contact details are shown on the BF website.

6. Sign a Code of Conduct Form

- You will need to display and abide by the highest levels of conduct whilst coaching.
- This can be evidenced by completing the Safety and Codes of Conduct declaration form and sending into British Fencing.
